

The fifth round was played without anything extraordinary happening (no injuries, no extra end, no replacement). In the men's games there was no tight game. The Canadian, Russian and Ukrainian teams succeeded quite clearly over the Finnish, Japanese and Swiss team. In contrast the women's games were very close. Here Canada and Croatia could finally win.

In the women's tableau we know now who has to play a tie break game and who qualifies straight for the playoff matches.

The last round was played on three sheets by men teams only. The Swiss team lost against Canada and remained on the third place after the round robin. In the match Japan playing Russia it was a draw after nine ends. The Japanese men could decide the game in the last end even without having the last stone. So they became 4th and qualified for the playoff games. There won't be any tiebreak games in the men's competition
